## Statement on 2025 – 2026 Enacted State Budget

Hauppauge, NY (May 9, 2025): After months of discussion and negotiation, we have a 2025 -2026 state budget. While not all of our hospital concerns were addressed, we appreciate the governor and legislature's investment in Medicaid outpatient rates, which takes another step toward closing the gap between the cost of providing care and reimbursement. Even with this bump in reimbursement, a payment shortfall will persist for all hospitals. For financially distressed providers, who are most heavily impacted by the Medicaid shortfall, the budget also includes the continuation of important funding streams. This commitment is critical at a time when the federal government is weighing steep cuts to the Medicaid program, which is essential to providing access to affordable care for New Yorkers. In our two suburban regions alone, more than 25 percent of Long Island and Hudson Valley residents are covered by Medicaid.

Unfortunately, these investments are partially offset by a steep increase in the MTA payroll tax we estimate an increased hit to hospitals in the suburban regions of at least \$40 million annually. Important proposals on managed care reforms and healthcare workforce development ultimately were not included in the budget, but we look forward to continuing the conversation with legislators on these issues.
